

REACH Compliance Statement

Background of REACH

In June 2007, the European Union Regulation (EC) 1907/2006 concerning the Registration, Evaluation, Authorization and Restriction of Chemicals (REACH) was first released. The regulation came into force on 1st June 2007 and established European Chemical Agency (ECHA) which manages the Technical & Scientific aspects of REACH. This Regulation establishes specific duties and obligations for companies in the European Union (EU) that manufacture or import substances on their own, in preparations, or in articles.

Consideration of REACH

REACH adopted to addresses the production and use of chemical substances and their potential impacts on both Human Health and the Environment and to improve the same from the risks that can be posed by chemicals. REACH also promotes alternative methods for the assessment of hazardous substances in order to reduce the number of tests on animals.

Amendment

Commission Regulation (EU) 2015/830 dated 28 May 2015 amending Regulation (EC) 1907/2006 of the European Parliament and of the Council on REACH and released a list of Substances of Very High Concern (SVHC), such that 201 substances as per SVHC Candidate list, updated on 16 July 2019. REACH SVHC list is not a static list and it is updated once in six months, ECHA now added new substances in the list of candidates to the previous list (published on 16 July 2019). Thus, the current list now contains 219 substances (Published on 8 July 2021). ECHA now added new substances in the list of candidates to the previous list (Published on 8 July 2021). Thus, the current list now contains 224 substances (Published on 8 June 2022). ECHA now added new substances in the list of candidates to the previous list (Published on 8 June 2022). Thus, the current list now contains 233 substances (Published on 17 January 2023). ECHA now added new substances in the list of candidates to the previous list (Published on 17 January 2023). Thus, the current list now contains 253 substances (Published on 4th February 2026).
